The theme of this Sunday's liturgy is clearly love. In movies, television programs, and songs on the radio, the subject is very often about love. Even in the church, we speak frequently about love. The readings remind us that the center of all living, Christian or secular, is love.

What then is love? Love is reaching out to others without expecting anything in return. True love expresses itself in action rather than in words. Such is the love of God for his creation. God's love is poured out in abundance on every single creature and it continues to flow out whether there is a response or not. The Father's love, John's letter tells us, was expressed in our midst when he 'sent into the world his only Son, so that we could have life in him'. In his own words in John's gospel, Jesus would express this truth in this way: *'A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friend'*. (Jn. 15:13)

It is that love which we too are supposed to have. In the Gospel, Jesus gives us just one commandment: *"If you want to be my disciple, then you must love one another, as I have loved you."* It is this love that enables us to love our enemies and want to be reconciled with them. To love them with *God's love* is to want the very best for them, to want them to reform, to be changed, to be healed of hate and negativity. Therefore, John reminds us: *"Wherever there is love, there is God"*.

The unconditional love of a Christian is a way of life. It is an internal attitude which influences every single thing we do and say and think. *Fr. Peter*

A BLESSED EVENT CELEBRATED WITH BISHOP LARRY SILVA



NATIONAL Eucharistic Revival

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL | June 11, 2023 – July 17, 2024

THE CONCLUDING RITES: **After communion, it is convenient to leave a time of silence** so that both the priest and the faithful can take **advantage of those moments of intimacy** with the Lord. To complete the prayer of the people of God and to conclude the whole Communion Rite, the priest says the post-Communion prayer, in which we ask that the Mystery we have celebrated produce abundant fruit in the faithful and in the Church.

After the post-Communion prayer, **the priest greets the faithful and blesses them, tracing the sign of the Cross and invoking the Trinity:** *"The Father, and the son and the Holy Spirit." He does so as Our Lord who, speaking to His disciples in the moment of His ascension, "raised his hands, and blessed them. As he blessed them he parted from them and was taken up to heaven."* (Lk 24:50-51) So now, through the priest who represents Him, *the Lord blesses the Christian people, who have come together in the Eucharist to celebrate. The Eucharistic celebration ends with the **sending of the Christians into the world.*** In effect, as Christ sent out His disciples before ascending into Heaven, **"Go into the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature"** (Mk 16:15), now the same Christ, concluding the Eucharist, through the priest, sends out all the faithful, so that they go back to their ordinary lives, and always announce the Good News.

The concluding rite of the Mass is very short but important. The priest gives us God's blessing before we are dismissed to "go in peace to love and serve the Lord." Both the blessing and dismissal are important! We are given the graces of God's blessing that we will need as we live out our lives during the week. The dismissal reminds us that the Mass may be concluded, but our call to live out our Catholic identity goes with us to work, school, our family and friends. While we have been dismissed, it is a mark of respect to allow the priest and assisting ministers to leave first in the recessional hymn as we process out of Mass into the world.


